

Thomas Scott (1742-1821)

Scott was a son of an English cattle farmer, tenth of thirteen children. He became a curate (assistant pastor) at age 25, and from age 28-30 he lived near the famous **John Newton** of Olney. ("Amazing Grace") Through friendship with Newton, Scott was converted. When Newton moved to London, Scott became a curate at Newton's church in Olney. Not till he was 56 did he become Rector (pastor) of a church. He has a number of publications including *The Force of Truth*, (reprinted by Banner of Truth) which is about his conversion, and a whole Bible commentary. Some of his books were published posthumously by his son.
